Copy of Board's letter No. E[G]2010 FE1-2 dated 28.12.2011 [RBE No.157/201]

Sub: Inclusion of Institutes/Societies, updating name of Institution/ Society in the list of recognized Institutions, for membership and re-imbursement of membership fee.

Railway Board from time to time recognizes Institutions/Societies [both National and International] for the purpose of allowing Railway personnel to take membership and avail of reimbursement to the tune of 90% of the membership fee. Till date a total number of 131 institutions/societies [both National and International] on various subject areas have been recognized and notified for the purpose. The Ministry of Railways have further decided to recognized and notified for the purpose. The Ministry of Valuers, and [2] Quality Council include two more institutions namely, [1] Institution of Valuers, and [2] Quality Council of India in the list of recognized institutions/societies for the purpose of membership and reimbursement of membership fees.

- 2. The name of the institute namely, the 'Chartered Institute of Transport [India]' that had been originally recognized vide S.No.50 in the Annexure-'A' to Board's letter No. E[G] 83 FE1/4 dated 29.4.1988 has since been changed. The new name of the institute may be read as the 'The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport India [CILT-India]' [refer S.No.13 in the new list].
- 3. The updated/revised and consolidated lists of one hundred thirty three [133] such recognized institutions/societies [including the latest two] are attached as Annexure- 'A' & 'B'. Wide publicity may be given at all the relevant levels to encourage Railway personnel to take membership. The competent authority may process for reimbursement of membership fee duly taking the relevance of the membership to the area of work and to the organization into consideration and also conforming to the eligibility criteria laid down from time to time.

Sub: Recommendation No.67 of the Railway Accidents Enquiry Committee, 1978 (Sikri Committee) Implementation of.

In order to give encouragement to Officers and Supervisors to take up membership of technical and Professional National/International Institutions in improving their technical/professional competence, as recommended in para 67 of Railway Accident Enquiry Committee 1978. Board after accepting this recommendation issued instructions for allowing reimbursement of 90% of membership/subscription fee to Railway Officers for becoming members of professional institutions/societies recognised by the Board for the purpose.

Initially only Officers of the rank of Principal HODs were permitted 90% reimbursement of membership fee of one nation-al/international institute. Thereafter, in 1988 the benefit of the scheme/facility was extended to officers of the rank of JA Grade and above. In 1993, the scheme was further liberalised and officers in Sr. and Jr.Scale and Sr.Supervisors in grade Rs.2375-3500(RPS) and Rs.2000-3200(RPS) were also brought under the ambit of the scheme. Keeping in view the fast pace of technological advancement in all areas following the process of liberalisation/globalisation of country's economy and the IT revolution, Board re-viewed the policy in 1999 and allowed officers in JA Grade and above, the facilities of such reimbursement upto the maximum of 5 national/international institutions/societies including maximum 2 international institutions vide Board's letter No.E(G)/99 FE1-1 dated 5.5.1999.

On further review, Ministry of Railways have in partial modification of board's letter No.E(G)/99/FE1-1 dated 24.8.93 have decided that individual request from Sr.Scale/Jr.Scale officers and Sr.Subordinates in the grade of Rs.2375-3500 (RPS) and Rs.2000-3200 (RPS) may be considered for allowing 90% reimbursement of membership fee in respect of two national/international institutions/societies in deserving cases of which not more than one will be international institution. In respect of 90% reimbursement for second institution, Board's prior approval would be required.

Sub: Recommendation No.67 of the Railway Accident Enquiry Committee, 1978 (Sikri Committee)- 90% reimbursement of membership fee in respect of recognized professional Institutions/Societies.

As per extant instructions officers of the rank of JA grade and above are permitted to take up membership of a maximum of five professional Institutions/Societies of which not more than two can be International institutions. Officers below the level of JA grade upto Sr. Supervisors in the grade of Rs.2375-3500 (RPS) and Rs.2000-3500 (RPS) have been allowed

*to take up membership of two professional Institutions/Societies of which not more than one can be international. They can claim 90% re-imbursement in respect thereof. General Managers have been delegated powers to make 90% re-imbursement in favour of the officers only in respect of one Institution and for any re-imbursement for the second Institution onwards prior approval of Railway Board is necessary for which Railways are required to send proposals to Railway Board.

Railway Board have further reviewed the scheme and it has been decided that General Managers may make 90% re-imbursement of membership fee to Officers of JA grade and above in respect of membership of professional Institutions/Societies (recognized by Railway Board for the purpose of 90% re-imbursement of membership fee) upto a maximum of three Institutions/Societies, of which one can be international.

Similarly in respect of officers below the level of JA grade upto Sr. Supervisors, in grade of Rs.7450-11500 (RSRP) and Rs.6500-10500 (RSRP), the General Managers may make 90% reimbursement in respect of two Institutions/Societies including one International Institutions, of which they are allowed to take membership.

In case of any officer/supervisor wishing to take up membership beyond the limits laid down above, prior approval of the Board would be necessary for which, in deserving cases, the Railways/Units may send proposals to Railway Board in consultation with their FA&CAO along with General Manager's recommendation.

Sub: Recommendation No.67 of the Railway Accident Enquiry Committee,1978 (Sikri Committee) – 90% re-imbursement of membership fee in respect of recognized professional Institutions/Societies.

Ref: Railway Board's letter No.E(G)2004 FE1-5 dated 16.9.2004.

As per extant instructions Railway officers and Sr. Supervisors are permitted 90% reimbursement of annual/life membership fee in respect of taking up membership of professional Institutions/Societies. Railway Board have recognized professional Institutions/Societies from different disciplines for this purpose.

In the course of examination of proposals for 90% reimbursement of membership fee received from Railway Units, it has come to notice that Railway officers are also claiming the amount paid towards Registration Fee, Admission Fee, etc. along with the annual/life membership fee. In this regard it is clarified that 90% reimbursement is admissible only in respect of annual/life membership fee and no reimbursement is admissible in respect of the amount other than membership fee like Registration Fee, Admission Fee, etc.

This issues with the concurrence of Finance Directorate of the Ministry of Railways.
